
### **Answer all questions**

#### **QUESTION 1**

Figure 2 shows the proposed expansion to build a third runway for Heathrow Airport, which is located 14 miles west of Central London. As part of the expansion, the residential areas of Longford, Harmondsworth and Sipson will be lost to make room for the new runway and associated infrastructure.
